[Luk 21:24, 32 KJV] 24 And they shall fall by the edge of the sword, and shall be led away captive into all nations: and Jerusalem shall be trodden down of the Gentiles, until the times of the Gentiles be fulfilled.

... 32 Verily I say unto you, This generation shall not pass away, till all be fulfilled.

Well, it looks like Jerusalem is still being "trodden down" by the Gentiles and the "Six-Day War" might not actually be a fulfillment of the words of Jesus in Luke 21:24.

Tons of articles have been written on just what constitutes a generation, 20 years? 40? 80?

Even if the end of the "times of the Gentiles" could be dated from 1967 (which in my opinion is dubious) isn't it possible that it could be referring to the last living survivor of that generation?

This might not be as far off as it might first appear because we have an OT example that follows the same pattern of a predicted judgement taking place upon the death of the last surviving member of a generation -- Methuselah.

[Gen 5:27 KJV] 27 And all the days of Methuselah were nine hundred sixty and nine years: and he died.

According to some his name was predictive of the flood. "Methuselah" (meaning "Man of the dart/spear", or alternatively "his death shall bring judgment") it has been determined, died on the very day that the flood began.

Anyway, back to the notion that 1967 marked the end of "times of the Gentiles..." I'm not sure that Jerusalem isn't still being trodden down by the Gentiles. I mean the reality is that while Israel is technically in control of Jerusalem they are far from actually controlling the city.

Now I don`t want to be a gladiator as I appreciate you all don`t either. So in reply to your comments Gary let`s look at this teaching that we have all been taught - `the Lord coming as a thief in the night.`

Well the Lord said it, & I believe He will come as a thief in the night. The Lord also said `get behind me Satan.` & I believe He meant it but it wasn`t said to me or for me. It was said to Peter as we all know. Thus said let`s look at who the Lord spoke those words of `coming as a thief,` & why He said it.

Matt. 24: 42 - 44 & 25: 13 Here the Lord is talking to the people of Israel saying that He would come to them as a `thief in the night.` & thus they would not know `the day or hour.` Now in Romans the Holy Spirit tells Paul that Israel was in darkness. `let their eyes be darkened.` etc. (Rom. 11: 8 - 10)  
So if they are in darkness of course they are not going to know when the Lord comes for them.

Now Rev. 3: 3. Here the Lord we see is talking to some in the Body of Christ. (Sardis) He calls them `dead,` & tells them to `wake up....for if they don`t & continue in darkness then He will `come like a thief,` to them & they will not know at what hour He will come upon them.

So my question to you Gary & to all of us are you, we in darkness like Israel or Sardis, so that the Lord will come like a thief to us & that we will not know the day or hour of His coming?

Let`s look at your other scripture, the wonderful revelation by the Holy Spirit to the Thessalonians that hopefully describes us. But first let`s look at the THEM/THEY.

`For you yourselves know full well that the day of the Lord will come just like a thief in the night. While THEY are saying, "Peace & safety!" then destruction will come upon THEM suddenly like birth pangs upon a woman with child; & THEY shall not escape.` (1 Thess. 5: 2 & 3)

I certainly don`t want to be a part of the THEM/THEY with the Lord coming upon me like a thief in the night & not knowing when.

Looking to the Lord I believe He will keep me in the next group -

`BUT YOU, BRETHREN ARE NOT IN DARKNESS, THAT THE DAY SHOULD OVERTAKE YOU LIKE A THIEF; FOR YOU ARE ALL SONS OF LIGHT & SONS OF DAY. WE ARE NOT OF NIGHT NOR OF DARKNESS.`

Not shouting with the capitals but so rejoicing in my spirit at the revelation of not being in darkness nor that the day should overtake me/us as a thief.

So `therefore,` because of the above revelation,  
`therefore, encourage one another, & build up one another, just as you are doing.` (1 Thess. 5: 11)

36 "But of that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, but My Father only. 37 But as the days of Noah were, so also will the coming of the Son of Man be. 38 For as in the days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noah entered the ark, 39 and did not know until the flood came and took them all away, so also will the coming of the Son of Man be. 40 Then two men will be in the field: one will be taken and the other left. 41 Two women will be grinding at the mill: one will be taken and the other left. 42 Watch therefore, for you do not know what hour your Lord is coming. 43 But know this, that if the master of the house had known what hour the thief would come, he would have watched and not allowed his house to be broken into. 44 Therefore you also be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.

Three times Jesus says we cannot know the hour of His coming. If it was possible to know the exact hour a lot of people would put on their Sunday best to impress the Lord that they are ready.

But by not knowing the exact hour it shows what is in a person's heart. Those who make an effort to be ready are showing their love for the Lord and the things of God.

And thinking about this it can be seen as a thief in the night, to mean that it will happen when no one is even aware it is happening. A thief sneaks in at night and steals the goods, you have know idea that he is there taking things till after it is over. My analogy for what its worth.

Because Jesus made these statements concerning His return I cannot see how any of us could ever figure out the hour. With that said, I think we can know the signs of the times and this motivates us to be ready and have the oil in our lamps.

Some more good scriptures showing that Jesus was talking to Israel concerning His coming for them as a thief in the night. He comes as `a thief,` to them because they are in darkness. (Rom.11: 8 -10) Remember they not only rejected the Lord, the Messiah, but they also, as a nation rejected the Holy Spirit.

(Acts 28: 23 - 28)And it is not until after the tribulation when the Lord comes to them as their Messiah that God pours out His Holy Spirit upon them & they receive Him whom they have pierced.

`And I will pour out on the house of David & on the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the Spirit of grace & of supplication, so that they will look on Me whom they have pierced; & will mourn for Him, as one mourns for an only son.....` (Zech. 12: 10)

Also notice in Matt. 24: 36 that Jesus said that `not even the Son` not even He knew when that day would be. Why? Jesus, when He was on earth put aside His omniscience (etc) (Phil. 2: 7)& thus only operated as a man obedient to the Holy Spirit.

Now of course we know that the ascended, glorified & exalted Lord Jesus Christ is seated at the right hand of the father on His throne, equal, one with the Father & Holy Spirit & has all the attributes of the Godhead, omniscience being one. Thus now as the head of the Body Christ by His Holy Spirit leads us in the light & tells us quite clearly that -

`you are all sons of light & sons of day. We are not of night nor of darkness.....` Thus `the day should not overtake you like a thief.` We, in the Body of Christ will not be overtaken by surprise at the Lord`s coming. In the Bible it says: Jesus was setting alone on the Mt. of Olives, He was not preaching in a synagogue, nor in the temple, nor was He addressing a group of Israelites, He was not speaking to Pharisees, Sadducees, Lawyers or scribes.

In verse four of that chapter it says He is speaking in "private" to His disciples.

3 Now as He sat on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to Him privately, saying, "Tell us, when will these things be? And what will be the sign of Your coming, and of the end of the age?"

The next two chapters of the Bible Jesus is talking to His disciples about the end times in "private".

These passages are for us as well His disciples.

Jesus is telling us that:

42 Watch therefore, for you do not know what hour your Lord is coming. 43 But know this, that if the master of the house had known what hour the thief would come, he would have watched and not allowed his house to be broken into. 44 Therefore you also be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.

He is clearly speaking to His disciples and not to Israel and anyone in darkness.

I don't understand where you came up with this meaning when the Bible is very clear on who Jesus is talking to.

So we read that the Lord is talking to His disciples concerning when He would come again to Israel. The disciples were then to go & tell others in Israel about what Jesus had told them. Then later the disciples passed on this message about the Day of the Lord onto the Christians. For we read in 1 Thess. 5: 1 - 5 that they knew about the times & seasons & that the Day of the Lord would come, as Jesus said `like a thief,` to those in darkness.

And what joy those early Christians would have had to realise that God had not destined them for wrath and that the day of the Lord would not come to them as a thief, for they were not in darkness.

I read again your questions & see that you also ask about `those in darkness.` The disciples Jesus was speaking to were not in darkness, as you said. However Israel as a nation was as they rejected & killed their Messiah. Thought you & others would be interested in this if you didn`t know it already. We know that on the Temple Mount that the first temple by Solomon was built. Then later after that had been torn down the second temple was built by Nehemiah & others. Now from scripture (Ezekiel)we are told

that there will be a third temple built on this very spot, the Temple Mount. Every reference to all three temples on this site was a translation of the Greek word `Hieron.`

Any temple erected elsewhere was invariably from the Greek word `Naos.` This word is frequently rendered `Meeting place,` `dwelling,` or `Synagogue.`

Now people believe that this temple on Mount Moriah has to be built before the Lord returns because of the `abomination` in the Holy Place that the Lord & the Apostle Paul spoke of in Matt.24:15 & 2 Thess. 2:4. But that is incorrect & has caused much confusion. It is the word `Naos,` (temple elsewhere) that is used for the temple that the Anti-Christ will set up the abomination. And this temple in Jerusalem has already been built.

On August 1982 in the presence of the Prime Minister, Menachem Begin, Members of Cabinet & other notables, the Jerusalem great Synagogue was dedicated. It is situated in King George Street, & is constructed from the same local stone as was Solomon`s Temple. The central feature is a high tower containing five magnificent stained-glass windows, topped by two tablets of stone, bearing the ten Commandments.

In the interior, marble has been used extensively, especially for the Ark situated beneath the stained-glass windows. This I believe is the Holy Place which will be desecrated by the `Abomination` referred to by Jesus.

The Temple referred to by the Apostle Paul is built!

Now concerning I Thess. 5:4. We have to remember that Paul did not write in chapter and verses

so we have to look at what he is saying before and after some statements. This is a letter to the Thessalonian church which Paul commends them of their faith and love as abounding. Then in the latter part of the letter Paul writes concerning end time events. The conversation actually starts in chapter four.

Now concerning this verse in 5:4 I think it is answered in verse two as to our discussion on the Lord coming as a thief in the night.

2 For you yourselves know perfectly that the day of the Lord so comes as a thief in the night.

Paul is telling them that they should know that the Lord is coming as a thief in the night. Why? Because Jesus said He would in Matthew 24 when He was talking to His disciples in private.

Paul is then stating in verse four that we are not overtaken as we are the children who are walking in the light.

Paul is not saying you'll know the hour in which Jesus is returning but that it will not over take us and we would be caught unawares. Like the five foolish virgins when the bridegroom came they were over taken and found themselves with out oil in their lamps.

Paul goes on to say in verse six: 6 Therefore let us not sleep, as others do, but let us watch and be sober.

He is mainly stressing the importance of watching and being ready. I do not find that he is insinuating that we all know the exact hour of the Lord's return.

Don't misunderstand here what I am trying to say, What would be the purpose of knowing the exact hour and minute that Jesus is coming back if your walking in the light and making yourself ready?

Its not the exact hour that is of importance here its making ourselves ready and not getting caught up in the affairs of this life. I agree we can all look at the signs and this motivates some to make ready but should we not be making ourselves ready because of our Love for Jesus Christ and what He did for each of us on the cross?

I do find it interesting that Paul also speaks of the end times in the second letter as well. I was thinking earlier this subject is scattered through out the whole Bible.

Now tell me what would be the reason that a man would have to know the exact hour in time if you see the signs and are walking in the Spirit ready to meet Him?

Jesus said, the five wise virgins were ready, when the bridegroom came to the door, they did not

know the hour but they knew it was close and they had prepared for that moment. They knew He was coming and was prepared when He arrived.
