There is very little violent crime as well. I guess the bottom line is you're afraid you should probably stay home.

Lastly I'd like to say that I don't believe that Israel has any significance religiously or spiritually. They aren't holy places. You don't gain favor with God or become more holy by being there. You do gain a tremendous appreciation for the bible but there is nothing merit
