Arguing in favor of evolution for eg. Or theistic evolution. Or God and . . .

I find the whole subject of science interesting especially in light of all the discoveries going on. So I don't think we are not supposed to take any interest. I think Paul is saying 2 things

1. Avoid arguing over false science. Just stay with the word.
2. Some are going to believe false science anyway. Avoid the argument.
